The only time you see them is when they are cooking on assignment. They don't come backstage or anything to speak to you - they are like Simon Cowell is on X Factor. How dirty do you want me to go? I've put a lot of things in my mouth. I think sheep's brain... me and Louis Walsh had to do a Bushtucker trial for Text Santa and it was wrapped in pastry. It was vile but we raised £100,000.

What would you cook to impress at a dinner party?

I'd do a pasta dish with sticky toffee pudding

At Wimbledon I cooked a massive tray bake of treacle sponge pudding. It looked amazing out the oven but it was completely raw in the middle and we couldn't actually serve it. I thought I was a goner.

Who are you closest to out of the other contestants?

Us three finalists got on ridiculously well. We set up a Whatsapp group and were messaging each other and still are now. I think they will be friends for life.
