

As Kimberly is expecting a daughter with model husband Max Rogers, it wasn't surprising that the baby shower was adorned with pink flowers, Neom candles and balloons. Guests were also given pink Lily Belle friendship bracelets and the centrepiece was a pink cake topped with a rubber duck, from chocolatiers Choccywoccydoodah, which Kimberly couldn't resist tucking into despite her healthy, no-sugar regime.



"Max has just finished painting it and we've kept it fairly neutral with a woodland theme, similar to our wedding back in February. My grandmother Jane knitted a little blanket to carry me home from the hospital in and I wanted to do the same for my little girl. I just need to put the satin trim around the edge and it's finished," she beams proudly.

It's ironic that Kimberly's first ever baby shower is not in her native America, where they are par for the course, but in her adopted home city of London, over Home House's quintessentially English champagne afternoon tea.

T'm an Anglophile," she says. "I really love it here. As the seasons change and it gets a little colder, it starts to feel special around Christmas. I love it all. And Max is such an Englishman. He's very proud of his country. I've never felt that pride before, but I do when I'm here.'

I was so lucky and fortunate to have this opportunity to share my passion and give dancers a platform to shine. Now, nearly five years later, I'm married, calling the UK my home and am about to have a baby. *Got to Dance* really has brought a lot into my life. It's a tough one to say goodbye to."

But does it mean Kimberly will be able to enjoy some maternity leave?
